

For promotion of young academics in sports science, the Swiss Society of Sports Science (SGS/4S) biannually awards the **SGS Dissertation Prize**. In 2025, a new format will be introduced in line with the focus of the SGS/4S Annual Conference 2025 "Knowledge transfer and sustainability in sport practices". The prize will be awarded to the author of a dissertation with outstanding scientific and/or social impact, that is presented briefly and clearly to the diverse audience at the 16th Annual Conference.

Rules for Participation:

- 1. Eligibility: All authors of a sports science dissertation (cumulative or monograph) accepted at a Swiss university, and Swiss citizens with a sports science dissertation accepted at universities outside of Switzerland, acceptance between 01.09.2022 and 15.11.2024.
- 2. Assessment: The primary criterion for selection for a short presentation is a clear and compelling argument regarding the scientific and/or social impact presented in the submitted abstract of the thesis. The abstracts must exclusively refer to the dissertation already assessed by the official referees.
- Presentation (180 s): Authors of selected submissions will present their work at the 16th Annual Conference of the SGS/4S 2025, including a clear, concise and yet compelling explanation of the research topic with a focus on the scientific and/or social impact. This 3-min presentation shall be supported visually by a graphical abstract (on one [1] Powerpoint-slide).
- 4. Prize: The SGS/4S dissertation prize is endowed with CHF 3'000.
- 5. Application Documents: The following documents must accompany the application (as separate pdf-files):
 - a. Curriculum Vitae
 - b. Declaration of the applicant that they fulfill the eligibility criteria
 - c. Dissertation
 - d. Copy of the acceptance of the dissertation by the respective university
 - e. Abstract (max. 8'000 characters, including max. 5 references)
- **6.** Submission: All documents (5 a e) must be submitted in electronic form to Prof. Dr. Elke Gramespacher and Dr. Michael Wälchli, SGS Board Members for *promotion of early-stage researchers* at: <u>elke.gramespacher@fhnw.ch.</u>
- 7. Deadline: Closing date for submission is 15 November 2024.
